

## **Jarrett Moehn recently earned the Boy Scout Eagle Rank with Troop 1656, Boy Scouts of Americas highest honor.**

Jarrett began his trail to Eagle as a Bear in 2nd grade with Pack 1680. He went on to earn his Cub Scout Arrow of Light (Cub Scouts Highest Honor), before joining Troop 1656. Over years he worked to achieve the ranks of Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class, First Class, Star, Life and Eagle. The first few ranks focused on first aid and life skills as well as service to the community. The later ranks reinforced these skills and added leadership and additional service with an Eagle project to complete while he was Life. Jarrett was also required to earn 21 Merit Badges 12 which are mandatory including Emergency Preparedness, Personal Fitness, Personal Management, Swimming, Environmental Science, Family Life, First Aid, Camping, Citizenship in the Community, Citizenship in the World and Citizenship in the Nation and Communications. Jarrett accomplished all these challenges and currently has 42 Merit badges and earned his St. Paul religious Medal and the Conservation Award.



For Jarrett's Eagle Project he selected the Non-profit Organization AnySoldier.com a 501(c) (3). AnySoldier.com is an organization that is entirely family-run and reaches out to the community through their website. The organization supports soldiers in all branches of the military, both active duty and reservists, and they have become one of the leaders in the efforts to make sure the men and women who have been deployed for the war are cared for and not forgotten via letters and packages. Jarrett used his leadership skills by working with Marty Horn the founder of AnySoldier.com to come up with a plan to support a Marine squadron. Over four months Jarrett championed for support and spent countless hours of letter writing, making speeches and coordinating the needs of the squadron. With his guidance and the help of his troop family and friends he exceeded his goal and was also even able to support a second squadron for the organization.

In addition to his Eagle project Jarrett has spent many hours being an active community supporter. Some have been The Angle Food Project, Adopt A Highway Trash Cleanup, Volunteering at George Ranch a living History Museum, Community Easter Egg hunts, Hurricane food drives, Beacon Ministry and Pecan Grove Volunteer Fire department fund raisers – "Five Miles My Way".

The Troop 1656 is part of the Brazos District in the Sam Houston Area Council. The Troop is chartered by the Knights of Columbus and meets at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Richmond.
