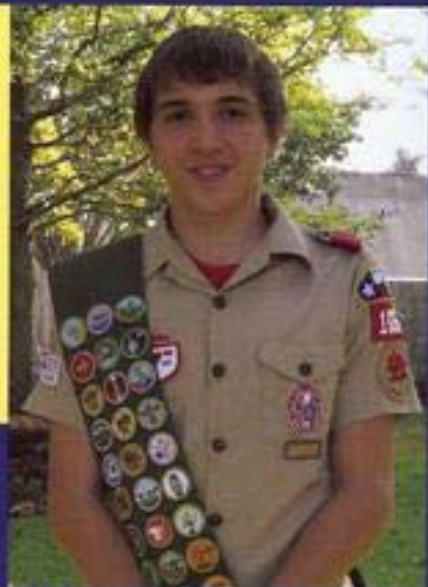


Troop 1656
